Technical Committees and Projects Updates:

Project Board Meeting: The first ETN Project Board Meeting took place on 23 July in Malmö, Sweden and was kindly hosted by E.ON. During the meeting, the members of the Project Board discussed the on-going projects, new project initiatives and opportunities for future (EU) projects as well as how to influence future EU calls.

Hot Borescoping initiative: The goal of the hot borescoping initiative is to reduce the GT downtime associated with a borescope inspection to one weekend. During a meeting on 9 July, hosted by EDF in Paris, interested partners brainstormed on various ways to reduce the GT outage, by enabling borescope inspections at higher temperatures and thus reducing the cool down times. The input from a GT OEM is necessary to provide further insight into the hot environment.
