What is Horizon Europe?



- EU's key funding programme for research and innovation
- It has a budget of €93.5 billion (C\$ 137 billion) for 2021 – 2027
- It is divided into three pillars for implementation

Canada part of Horizon Europe



- Canada became Associated to Pillar II of Horizon Europe on 3 July
 2024
- Associated membership is the closest form of cooperation, giving the Canadian organisations the opportunity to participate on equal terms with their EU counterparts
 - Canadian entities can join AND lead research consortia
 - Canadian entities will be funded directly from the programme, while
 Canada will contribute to its budget
